Pegasus Notes

Getting to Mt Hotham

Driving to Hotham from Melbourne

From Melbourne - popular route: Take the Hume Hwy to Wangaratta then the Great Alpine Road direct to Mount Hotham via Bright and Harrietville, or the snow road via Milawa & Oxley to Myrtleford & Mount Hotham. Travel time around 4.5 hours. Distance: 357 km.

Alternative route: Take the Princes Hwy to Bairnsdale, then the Great Alpine Road direct to Mount Hotham via Omeo. Travel time around 5 hours. Distance: 457 km.

During heavy snow falls the road via Harrietville may be closed. If this road is closed you will almost always be able to drive up via Omeo. It is important you check access to the resort prior to starting your trip as road closure may

mean lengthy waits for the road to open and/or arranging alternate, last minute accommodation off the mountain. If in doubt, sometimes the longer trip via Bairnsdale and Omeo may be the better alternative.

Warning: By Law all vehicles, including 4wd's, must carry correct fitting chains when entering Victorian Alpine Resorts. Signs will be displayed when and where you are required to use them.

Driving from Sydney

Take the Hume Highway to Albury-Wodonga and follow the snow signs to Yackandandah then turn off to Myrtleford. At Myrtleford turn on to the Great Alpine Road to Bright then, Harrietville and Mount Hotham.

Driving from Queensland

Take the Newell Highway from Queensland to Tocuwal and Cobram, then on to Wangaratta and the Great Alpine Road.

From Adelaide: Mt Hotham is 950 kms from Adelaide. Ten hours drive via Pinaroo, Ouyen and Swan Hill or alternatively via Bordertown and Shepparton.
