OUR MOUNTAIN

MT HOTHAM HISTORY

The History of Mount Hotham starts way back in the 1850's when early grazing, mining and service activities played an important role in the growth of recreation. They helped popularise the area and provided a capital infrastructure of tracks, huts, transport and accommodation services upon which a tourist industry was built. Sight-seeing from the Alpine Road, mining tracks and cattle pads was the main early tourist activity and was conducted during the Christmas period; there was virtually no patronage during winter.

By 1921 it became clear that some form of accommodation or shelter was required at Mt Hotham itself. The Alpine Road was popular amongst sightseers and with proposed improvements tourist patronage was expected to expand. The Country Roads Board commenced road works in 1922 and a cottage was planned for Hotham as a patrolman's residence and travellers shelter. The site was chosen with regard to distances from other shelters, its commanding position within the winter snowfields and the snow bound sections of the Alpine Road. The cottage was built of stone by Italian masons and christened 'Hotham Heights'.

By 1928 however, a more professional and full time accommodation service was clearly required as larger numbers of skiers were now visiting the mountain and their object at Hotham Heights was officially to promote skiing for the sake of tourist revenue. 1933 was a significant date in the development of the Hotham Resort. In that year the Railways Department took over the management of Hotham Heights, by Ministerial request. They publicised skiing, and erected signs near Hotham Heights throughout their tenure that lasted until 1952.

From the late 1940s to early 1960s progress was made towards modernisation and it was during this period Hotham grew in stature as a Resort. This happened because of growing pressure for development from skiers and resulted in the skiing community largely taking over the planning and administration of Hotham.

The first step towards club development was in 1944 with the Alpine Ski Club, other lodges soon followed: Wangaratta Ski Club (1946), Edelweiss Ski Club (1947) and University Ski Club (1948).

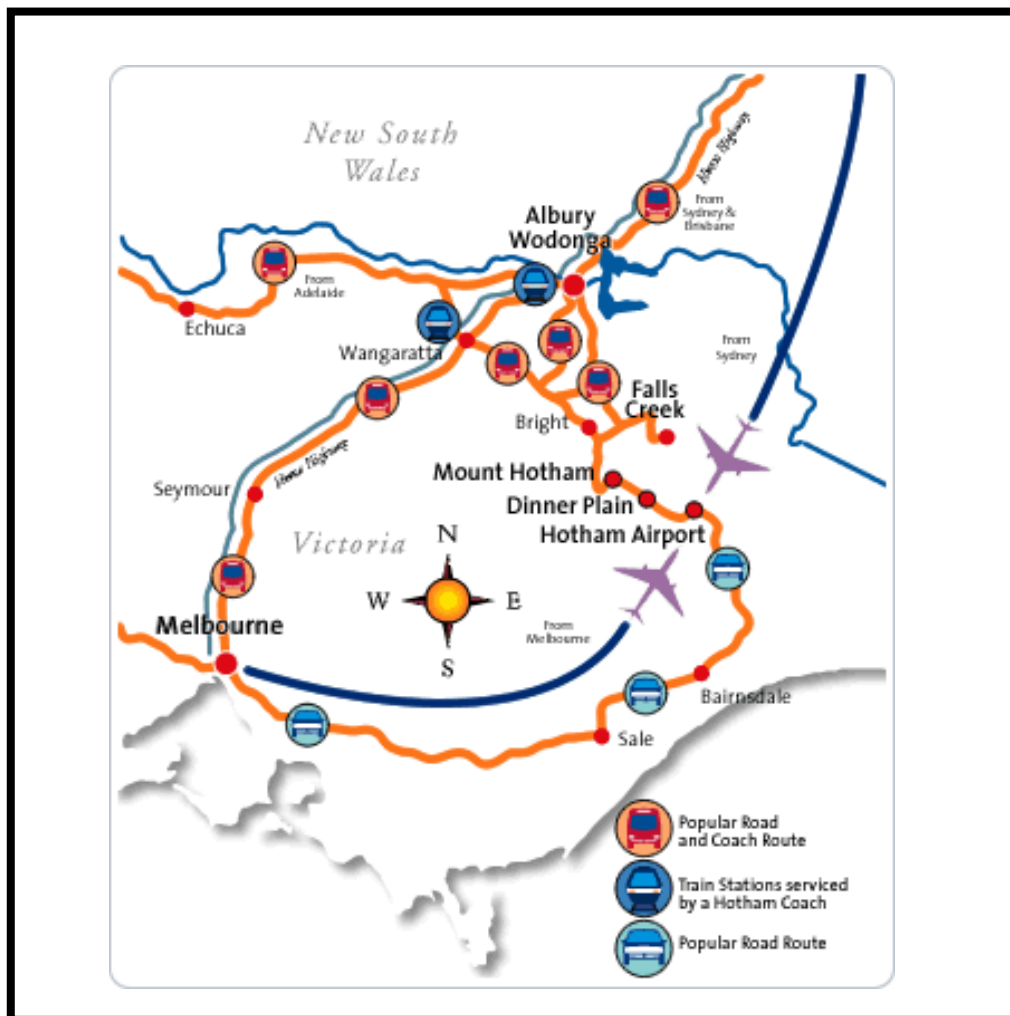
Apart from the erection of club lodges, emergency radio communication was installed and in 1951 Hotham's first ski tow was constructed. In 1962 a Committee of Management was formed under the chairmanship of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey. The Department of Crown Lands and Survey was responsible for Mount Hotham until the formation of the Alpine Resorts Commission in 1983.

The Alpine Resorts Commission managed Mount Hotham until April 1998 when the Mount Hotham Alpine Resort Management Board assumed responsibility for the management of the resort.

WHERE IS MT HOTHAM



Hotham village is located in the heart of the Victorian Alps, surrounded by Alpine National Park. It is classic Australian wilderness up here. Think snowgums, think rolling mountain ridges, think Man from Snowy River country...it's breathtaking.

The village itself is at 1750m, just below the summit of Mount Hotham (1861m). And, it's easily accessible, thanks to Australia's newest touring route, The Great Alpine Road.

The Great Alpine Road runs from Wangaratta in the north of Victoria, to Bairnsdale in the south - and Mount Hotham lies in the centre.

DISTANCES AND APPROXIMATE TIMES

- Melbourne to Wangaratta 239km/2.5 Hours
- Wangaratta to Mount Hotham 130km/2 Hours
- Mount Hotham to Dinner Plain 11km/10 Mins
- Dinner Plain to Bairnsdale 162km/3 Hours
- Bairnsdale to Melbourne 283km/3 Hours

HOW DO I GET THERE

Choose your mode of transport from your state, including a direct flight to Mount Hotham Airport, private cars, coach or train.

The Mount Hotham Airport brings the ski fields closer to you. Located just 20 kms from Hotham and 10 kms from Dinner Plain, you land at Australia's highest commercial airport only minutes from the slopes. With direct and connecting flights Australia wide, fly in to Hotham this season and enjoy more time to live the high life.

It's still a wonderful trip by car though, as Hotham is located at the highest point of the Great Alpine Road - a classic Australian motoring route. There is sealed road access from both sides of the mountain, ample overnight parking and unloading zones close to your accommodation. A Resort Entry Fee is applied to vehicles and passengers of coaches and taxis entering the resort during the declared snow season. For further details please see the Resort Entry section of this guide.

FROM MELBOURNE AND TASMANIA

- Fly direct from Melbourne to Albury Airport and then bus from Mt Hotham approx travel time is 2 hours.
- Fly with a private charter to Mt Hotham Airport, Lilydale Charters.
- Take the Hume Highway to Wangaratta and then the Great Alpine Road via Bright and Harrietville, travel time is about 4.5 hours.
- Or take the Princes Highway to Bairnsdale and the Great Alpine Road via Omeo and Dinner Plain, travel time is about 5.5 hours.
- Coaches depart daily from Melbourne's Spencer Street Coach Terminal and Tullamarine Airport and travel via the Hume Highway & Great Alpine Road to Myrtleford, Bright and Harrietville.
- Trains depart daily from Spencer Street Station to Bairnsdale

TRAVELLING FROM SYDNEY

- Fly direct from Kingsford Smith Airport to Albury Airport and then bus to Mt Hotham approx travel time 2 hours.
- Take the Hume Highway to Albury-Wodonga and follow the snow signs to Yackandandah then turn off to Myrtleford.
- At Myrtleford turn on to the Great Alpine Road to Bright, then Harrietville and Mount Hotham.
- For train travellers, the XPT connects with Snowball Express Coach Service at Myrtleford (via the V-Line bus service from Wangaratta Train Station).

QUEENSLANDERS

- Fly to Sydney and board a connecting flight to Albury Airport.
- Alpine World Midweek Coach is the most economical way to the snow from Brisbane. Call Alpine World Midweek Coaches on 1300 138 311 for bookings.
- Take the Newell Highway from Queensland to Tocumwal and Cobram, then onto Wangaratta and the Great Alpine Road.

FROM ADELAIDE AND PERTH

- Overnight luxury air conditioned coaches, complete with video entertainment, depart from Adelaide twice weekly direct for Hotham. Contact Ski Connection on (08) 8223 5355.

BY SHUTTLE

Christians Mt Hotham Airport Ground Shuttle

Christians Bus company is the official operator of the transport link between the Mt Hotham Airport - Dinner Plain and the Mt Hotham Resort. Their coaches meet every arriving and departing Mt Hotham Qantaslink flight from both Melbourne and Sydney. All vehicles operated on this service have 46 – 56 seats, are fully air-conditioned, have extra large under floor luggage compartments and some of the vehicles even boast automatic wheel chains operated from the driver's seat while the vehicle is in motion saving you precious skiing time. Bookings are not necessary and tickets may be purchased at the Coach Desk located in the Hotham Airport Terminal.

Dinner Plain

When traveling to or from Hotham Airport, the coach will set down and pick up passengers at any point in Dinner Plain along Big Muster Drive or Halter Lane.

Hotham Resort

When traveling to and from the Mt Hotham Resort, the coach will set down or pick up passengers at the Hotham Transit Lounge or at any location along the Great Alpine Road including Arlberg Hotel and Jack Frost. Passengers traveling from either Hotham Resort or Dinner Plain to the Hotham Airport who are not sure of the pick up arrangements should call Hoys Mt Hotham on 1300722191 to confirm arrangements.

BY PLANE

Yes, it's true. You can even fly to Hotham. That's because Australia's highest commercial airport is just 20 km from Hotham (and 10 km from Dinner Plain).

This can be done by private charter, for example Lilydale Charters, from Melbourne to Mt Hotham Airport

You can also fly direct from Melbourne, Sydney and Canberra to Albury Airport

WHAT DO I BRING TO PREPARE

Planning and preparation are the keys to having a safe and enjoyable winter holiday in the snow.

When you pack your bags for this year's snow holiday don't forget to include:

- Boots with a bit of a tread!
- Waterproof pants and jacket
- Woollen beanie or hat
- Waterproof gloves
- Plenty of layers like t-shirts, skivvy, woolly jumper/fleece and underclothing
- Casual clothes for après
- Sunscreen and lip balm
- Camera - the views are fantastic and you'll have to get a shot of you in the heart of the Victorian Alps.

Even on the shortest visit to the snow it is important to be fully prepared for and aware of the nature of the alpine environment.

When planning it is important to prepare your vehicle for a trip to the snow, organise your clothes and equipment, improve your fitness, organise lessons, take special care with children and arrange to leave details of your trip.

Watch the sun

In the Alps you can be exposed to strong direct sun and reflection from the snow, so you need to wear lots of sunscreen and protect your eyes from glare by always wearing sunglasses. The glare off the snow can be particularly strong and can lead to 'snow blindness' where your eyes will sting, show redness and possibly need medical attention.

Try before you buy

If you're new to the snow, it's best to rent your equipment before you buy. That way you can graduate to more advanced equipment as your skiing/boarding improves at an affordable rate. There are plenty of rental shops on the mountain so you can conveniently swap sizes and styles during your stay.

Driving and parking in the snow

Carry snow chains - it's a legal requirement. All vehicles entering the Great Alpine Road Reserve (base of mountain) must have snow chains for their tyres as a safety precaution and fit them where directed. Chains can be purchased from any of the local chain suppliers close to Mt Hotham. Billies Ski Hire in Omeo, Hoys Ski Hire in Harrietville and Rays Ski Hire in Myrtleford all stock chains.

The Mt Hotham Snow Chain Service, linked to Hoys Ski Hire, operates on the Harrietville side of the village and will fit your chains for you at the point where you are directed to fit them. The small fee that the guys charge is probably one of the best purchases of your snow holiday!!!

- Remember antifreeze in your radiator
- Leave your windscreen wipers up off the windscreen (avoids them freezing to the glass)
- Leave your handbrake OFF and your car in gear (avoids freezing the brake on)

Getting to your accommodation

The village of Mt Hotham is a linear resort so it follows along the Great Alpine Road and almost all accommodation is within 50 -100 metres of the road. There are unloading zones along the road where you can stop, unpack your gear from the car and either walk the short distance or have your luggage transported by oversnow transport to your accommodation. Once you have dropped your gear into the lodge or perhaps as the rest of your group does that, you can park your car in the overnight car parks at the end of the village.

The free village bus service will pick you up and drop you off at one of the 8 bus stops closest to your accommodation. Remember that the free village bus service operates daily from 6:45am until 3am 7 days a week.

DRIVING IN THE ALPS

Chain Fitting

- Fit chains at bays where you see the "Fit Chains Here" sign.
- Always fit chains to driving wheels only. When required, four wheel drive vehicles should fit chains to front wheels.
- Chain fitting bays are level and make fitting easier. If you don't use the chain fitting bay you may find yourself in a lot of trouble. Chains are hard to fit on slopes, and you will obstruct other vehicles and snow clearing equipment.
- At all resorts, you can be fined a hefty fee for not carrying and fitting chains as directed.
- If it has not been necessary to fit chains when travelling to the resort, it is advisable to fit them upon arrival in preparation for the return trip. It is quite difficult to fit them to cars covered by snow.
- Do not drive faster than 40kph.

Chain Fitting Checklist

- Fit chains to driving wheels only.
- Always test fit chains before a trip.
- Fit chains at fitting bays on level ground.
- If chains fall off or loosens when a vehicle is in motion stop and check brake lines for damage, before re-tensioning.
- Keep speed below 40kph.
- Carry a torch, plastic garbage bag and gloves to make fitting easier.
- Use correct fitting chains.
- Tyres must be in good condition with minimal wear.
- The use of diamond pattern chains is recommended at most resorts.
- Chains alter your car's handling, take time to readjust your driving and take care!

Parking

- Park only where directed. If you do not, you run the risk of another vehicle or snow clearing vehicle running into what looks to the driver like just another drift of snow.
- Do not apply the handbrake: moisture can freeze the cables and brake linings.
- Leave the car in gear with the front wheels turned away from the slope.
- Always park as close to the bank as possible, to leave room for two-way traffic.
- Do not use rocks to chock wheels as they may damage snow clearing machines.
- Remove wheel chocks from parking area when leaving.
- Even if chains were not required to enter the area, it is advisable to fit them when parking. It is much easier than trying to fit them later for the return trip if weather conditions change or the vehicle is snowbound.
- Cover the radiator to help prevent freezing.
- Periodically clear snow from on and around the vehicle.
- Carry a shovel

More Hints

- Lift wipers from windscreen or place in a plastic bag if parking for an extended period so that wipers do not stick to the glass.
- Cover door locks with masking tape to stop locks freezing up.
- Don't use wooden chocks, these tend to slip on icy surfaces.
- Clear all glass and mirrors of ice before attempting to drive away from snowfields.
- For fast demisting of the front windscreen, use the car's heater and fan in conjunction with the vehicle's air-conditioner.
- Warm the engine for a few minutes before driving off.
- Motoring on alpine roads not only requires concentration and adept driving skills, but also a lot of patience. Keep your cool if stuck in a long queue of traffic, and always follow directions by resort staff and road signs. They are there for your safety.

TICKET OUTLETS FOR VISITOR RESORT ENTRY PERMITS

Car Permits - All car permits can be purchased from either the gates, the RMB office or from one of our off mountain sellers (Hoys – Harrierville, Rays – Myrtleford, Coachhouse – Bright, Omeo Ski Hire – Omeo) apart from the complimentary permits which must be organised through the Mt Hotham Alpine Resort Management Office.

Bus Permits - All Bus Permits can be purchased from either the gates or office apart from the Dinner Plain Bus Day Entry Permit which must be purchased on the Dinner Plain Bus and the Dinner Plain us Annual Permit which must be purchased through the Mt Hotham Alpine Resort Management Office.

VISITOR PARKING

Visitor Parking covers vehicles holding a valid Day Authorised Permit, Multi Day Authorised Permit, Season Authorised Car Permit or Season Authorised Complimentary Permit.

DAY PARKING

Day parking is available in designated areas within the village.

Vehicles holding a valid Day Authorised Permit, Multi Day Authorised Permit, Season Authorised Car Permit or Season Authorised Complimentary Permit may park in these areas between the hours of 7am until 11pm. After 11pm these vehicles must be moved to the overnight parking areas.

Due to safety reasons for the 2007 season vehicles holding a valid Day or Multi Day Authorised Permit will be allowed to park in the Ford Carpark until 8:30am or until the carpark is full and then additional vehicles will be required to park at the closest Day Car Parking area to their entry position. Therefore visitors entering from the Omeo/Dinner Plain side will park from Wire Plain Carpark and visitors entering from the Harrietville/Bright side will park from Big D Car Park. These restrictions do not apply to visitors holding a valid Season Authorised Car Permit or Season Authorised Complimentary Permit.

Please observe and comply with all road signage, as parking regulations will be strictly enforced.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Overnight parking commences at 200 metres below Transport Stop 8 (Langi Taan Ski club) and is marked with a sign saying "All Hours Parking Commences Here". Look for the large red sign indicating the start of Overnight Parking.

Vehicles holding a valid Day Authorised Permit, Multi Day Authorised Permit, Season Authorised Car Permit or Season Authorised Complimentary Permit may park in these areas Overnight.

THERE IS NO OVERNIGHT PARKING WITHIN THE VILLAGE.

On Friday nights car parkers are on duty to assist and direct arrivals to parking areas (look for the flashing orange lights).

If visitors arrive after the ticket boxes have closed it is important that they make their way to the overnight car parking areas and purchase an authorised permit from the Mt Hotham Alpine Resort Management Office **prior to 10am** the following morning.

Please observe and comply with all road signage, as parking regulations will be strictly enforced.

LOADING AND UNLOADING ZONES

Visitors may load/unload in 15/30 minute loading zones near their accommodation. Visitors arriving must move their vehicles to overnight parking areas, a bus will visit regularly to check for arrivals. For a speedy pickup you can advise a bus driver who will arrange for a bus to collect you as soon as possible.

PARKING INFRINGEMENTS

Parking infringements will be issued to vehicles that do not adhere to the parking signs.

Payments for parking infringements can be made at the Mt Hotham Alpine Resort Management Office, by phone or by mail.

If any vehicles receive a parking infringement and wish to contest they must do so in writing to Mt Hotham Alpine Resort Management PO Box 188, Bright, Victoria 3741.

No decisions or cancellations will be made on parking infringements verbally.

TRANSPORT TO OVERNIGHT VISITOR CAR PARKING

Below Bus Stop 8 (overnight visitor car parking areas) for safety reasons buses can only stop in certain areas. This service runs from 6.45am till 3.00am, seven days a week during the season (the service may finish earlier during the shoulder season).

If people wish to park their car in the overnight car parking area late at night and wish to ensure a bus will be there shortly after parking please inform one of the bus drivers before driving to your parking destination.

CROSS COUNTRY TRAILS

Like the idea of breathtaking views and tranquil surrounds...but still enjoy a challenge? Then cross-country skiing is a great scene to get into. And Mount Hotham won't disappoint - whatever your ability.

First of all, you'll never be short on choice. With over 35 km of trails, you can take your pick of circuits - from 2 km to 15 km.

Some trails start straight from the village. Or take the FREE village shuttle bus to Wire Plain (the starting point for most cross-country circuits up here).

Speaking of FREE, there are no trail fees for cross-country skiing at Mount Hotham!

And if you enjoy group events, there's always something happening throughout the season. Like the infamous 'Pub to Pub', which heads out from the General Store at Mount Hotham and ends at the Dinner Plain Hotel. It's a fantastic way to meet people, have fun, and experience the pleasures of cross-country.

Biathlon at Mt Hotham

There is a twelve-lane Biathlon range at Whiskey Flat, Mt Hotham, which forms the epicentre of Biathlon in Australia. The first ever Biathlon events in Australia were held at Mt Hotham and the Whiskey Flat range has played host to the Victorian and Australian Championships for almost 20 years. The high standard range combined with the first-class ski trails and grooming provided at Mt Hotham make Whiskey Flat an ideal location to conduct Biathlon events.

The facilities at Mt Hotham are used regularly by Australia's premier elite athletes, and have been the training focus for many of our past Olympians, including Australia's most successful Olympic Biathlete Kerryn Rim. In addition to being used by elite athletes, the Whiskey Flat range is also used by people of all abilities for various events, training and enjoyment.

Participation in Biathlon is open to anyone from the age of ten to 150 who would like to experience the enjoyment of this multi-sport event. The events that are conducted at Mt Hotham cater for all ages and abilities - from those who have never skied or handled a rifle before to the experienced cross-country skier or precision target shooter. There are introductory novice events, fun novelty events, events for juniors, citizen events and Championship events with junior, senior, masters and veteran categories

While it is necessary for participants to bring their own ski equipment, the Australian Biathlon Association can provide rifles. New participants are always welcome and coaching and other support will be provided by our many experienced coaches and participants.

In addition to the events that are held at Whiskey Flat throughout the ski season there are also several training camps and training days for participants who wish to undergo more concerted coaching and training in Biathlon. Once again, there is coaching available for people of all abilities with training days being held for rank beginners and longer training camps being held for elite athletes.

Resort Entry for Cross Country Skiers Skiing to Dinner Plain and Returning to Hotham

Prior arrangement can be made with the Resort Management office for cross country skiers who want to ski to Dinner Plain and catch the Dinner Plain bus back to Hotham. If you have already entered the Resort and paid gate entry Resort Management will organise for you to not pay gate entry when reentering the Resort on the same day of cross country skiing to Dinner Plain.

SKI PATROL

Mount Hotham Ski patrol operates in the winter season to reduce the risk of injury and exposure to hazard to all resort users, and provides assistance for injured or lost persons in the alpine region over winter.

Ski patrol is comprised of approximately 20 full and part time professional patrollers who work in conjunction with a dedicated team of volunteer patrollers. All active Patrollers are trained to a high level of skill that includes advanced emergency care, rope rescue and search techniques. Ski patrol maintains an ongoing training regime for all patrollers in order to keep their skills sharp and to develop the overall skill base of individuals and the patrol team. The Victoria Police, Rural Ambulance Victoria and the Australian Ski patrol Association, facilitates training.

Ski patrol achieves successful risk management through constant monitoring of the conditions in the resort and by educating resort users on safety. This includes constant weather monitoring, e.g., forecasts, wind direction, visibility and precipitation; monitoring of the resort terrain and an awareness of the volume of resort users. Education is achieved through talking with resort users in the Ski area and the village and through organized group talks and the recent development of the Snow Survival Skills course.

The Snow Skills programs are designed to increase awareness and educate visitors about the alpine environment. Through the provision of these courses we hope to prepare people for the Alps and as a result prevent accidents rather than cure them. Contact the ski patrol for information on the courses.

A typical day for Ski Patrol commences with a morning meeting at 8.15am. Conditions, forecasts and the outlook for the day are discussed before the group breaks away to assess the entire resort. Patrollers are then dispatched through out the resort to monitor and report on the conditions. This monitoring and hazard assessment continues through the day and is the prime focus of a Ski Patroller, secondary to responding to calls for assistance.

Ski Patrol are responsible for ensuring no-one is left stranded in the resort over night. Patrol check all open runs at the end of the day and are the last people off the hill. The last patroller usually gets their boots off about 5.30 PM, that's a long day in Ski or Snowboard boots!

Ski Patrol operate as first responders for searches of missing persons. Patrollers are required to work as a team to search the nearby terrain surrounding the resort. This terrain can be difficult to travel in under perfect conditions and the task is complicated even more with the addition of poor visibility and or poor weather conditions such as falling snow or even worse, rain! Patrollers must be able to develop a solid skill base of backcountry knowledge, e.g., navigation, route selection and preparedness to participate in missing person searches. This is a demanding task and Patrollers are required to push their physical limits, often spending hours if not days scouring rugged terrain for people in need of help.

Patrollers at Mount Hotham are easily recognizable by their uniforms. Most patrollers now are wearing red and black with a large white cross on the back and a smaller cross on each arm. We also have a small amount of patrollers still in the old blue uniform with yellow Maltese cross' on each arm.

MAIN PURPOSES OF SKI PATROL

The main purposes of the Mount Hotham Ski Patrol are to:

- Minimise the risk of injury and exposure to hazards for all resort users.
- To educate resort users about safe and appropriate behavior in the Alpine environment.
- Administer first aid assistance to injured persons on the snow.
- Transfer those requiring further medical attention to the Ambulance Service and then onto the Mount Hotham Medical Centre.
- In conjunction with the Victorian Police and other emergency services to search for and rescue skiers lost in Alpine areas.
- Serve the public with other assistance and skiing information.
- Improve safety standards within the resort.

SNOW SAFETY

SNOW SAFETY AT MT HOTHAM

The Victorian alpine environment is a beautiful destination for winter or summer holidays and a venue for many challenging and exciting activities including skiing and bushwalking. The Victorian Alps, however can be hazardous if visitors are careless and irresponsible.

Planning and preparation are the keys to having a safe and enjoyable alpine experience.

The following information is essential and relevant to all visitors to alpine areas, regardless of the length of the visit or the type of alpine activity.

SNOW SAFE TIPS

Planning

When planning your trip to the alps select a resort or area which caters for you and your groups needs as facilities, experiences and opportunities vary widely between resorts and various parts of the Alpine National Park. When planning it is important to prepare your vehicle for a trip to the snow, organise your clothes and equipment, improve your fitness, organise lessons, take special care with children and arrange to leave details of your trip. Plan your alpine holiday carefully and you'll have a great time.

Driving on alpine roads

Like skiing, driving in snow and ice conditions is an acquired skill. Extreme care is required when driving on alpine roads in winter.

Clothing

Most of us like to picture ourselves enjoying the Alps in sunshine, and we do have our share of sunny days in Australia. However, alpine weather is unpredictable and a fine sunny day can quickly deteriorate into cold, wet, high wind or blizzard conditions. Your clothing, therefore, must be versatile and you should have ready access to protective clothing.

Skin and eye protection

Sunburn can be a serious problem, even on cloudy days. In addition to protective clothing, always use a good sunscreen with a high SPF to protect skin exposed to direct or reflected sunlight. To protect your eyes from the glare off the snow (which can lead to "snow blindness") the use of high quality sunglasses or goggles is essential, and wear a wide brimmed hat to protect you face on sunny days.

Helmets

Helmets are a serious option for children but a growing number of adults are using them for downhill skiing and snowboarding. Give it some thought.

Food

Food provides energy for movement and for maintaining your body temperature. The risk of hypoglycaemia (low blood sugar level) can be reduced by having good meals, maintaining fluid intake and stopping when tired. Popular high energy foods include: nuts, chocolate bars, hot drinks and soups, cheese, raisins and sultanas.

Trip intentions

Let someone know before you go. Check in when you return. Trip Intention forms are widely available from resort administration offices and police stations.

Pre-season fitness

Start your training well before the ski season or your trip. Training sessions must be regular and frequent - at least 3 times per week. Always warm up before an exercise session Children, as well as adults, will benefit from a pre-season fitness program.

Children

More children are getting into snow sports. Their need for learning and equipment, however, are different to those of adults. Skis, boards, boots and bindings can be bought new or second hand but

should be specifically made for children, not adapted for them, and equipment should be properly fitted by a reputable ski shop - remember that children only need light ski binding settings. Warm, protective clothing and head gear (ie a helmet) should always be worn by children.

Tobogganing

Tobogganing is one way of enjoying the great snow resort areas within Victoria. Tobogganing can be dangerous and great care should be taken. At resorts, toboggan in designated areas only. Away from resorts, find a gentle slope free from rocks and trees, with a safe run out at the bottom.

Snowsports School

Statistics prove that the more experienced skiers/boarders have less accidents and the best way to gain that experience is to take lessons. In any professional ski and boardriding school instruction, training and coaching always progresses from the level the student has already attained.

Equipment

Always check your equipment before using it. Prior to the ski season have your equipment serviced and checked.

Environment care

The Alpine environment is fragile. Please treat it with care and respect so that others may enjoy it after you.

Equipment security

Common sense and care will reduce the risk of loss or theft. Know where to locate your skis/board at all times. Operation Identification is a program aimed at theft prevention and involves marking your equipment for easy identification (we suggest your driver's licence number, with state prefix).

ALPINE CODE

Know and observe the code - it's your responsibility:

- Know your ability.
- Always stay in control.
- Be able to stop and avoid other people or objects.
- Take lessons from qualified professional instructors to learn and progress.
- Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or run or are not visible from above.
- When entering a trail or run or starting downhill, look uphill and give way to others.
- Always use proper devices to prevent runaway equipment. Ensure you equipment is in good condition.
- Avoid people ahead of you - they have right of way.
- Observe all signs and warning.
- Keep off closed trails or runs and out of closed areas.
- Before using any lift you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.
- Do not ski, snowboard, ride a chair or undertake any other alpine activity, if drugs or alcohol impairs your ability.
- If you are involved in a collision or witness an accident, alert Ski Patrol, remain at the scene and identify your self to the Ski Patrol.

Failure to observe the code may result in cancellation of your ticket by the Ski Patrol or other authorised personnel.
